

SURVEY RESULTS AS OF 5/23/06

Number of survey cards mailed: 1159

Number of responses received via mail or web: 361, or 31% of total mailed.

Number of parcels represented by these responses: 577, or 34% of the 1700 total parcels estimated in the project area.

These 577 parcels represent almost \$267 million in taxable property value, which is 43% of the total property value in the project area of \$622 million.

Of the responses received, 527 parcels voted "yes" to Question 3, "As some part of the financing of the restoration, I am willing to pay an MSTU on my property in the project area with the maximum rate to be at or below the caps put in place in the ordinance." The "yes" responses represent 91% of the total answers to this question.

RESULTS BY CLASSIFICATION

181 Gulf-front parcels voted yes, representing 93% of the total answers from gulf-front parcels, that they would support an MSTU for beach restoration.

288 Gulf Interior parcels voted yes, representing 92% of the total answers from gulf interior parcels, that they would support an MSTU for beach restoration.

58 Bayside parcels voted yes, representing 91% of the total answers from bayside parcels, that they would support an MSTU for beach restoration.

The answers to Questions 1 (I received adequate information) and 2 (the beaches should be restored) resulted in even higher percentages of "yes" votes. Once it has been determined that all remaining mail-in surveys have been received, a final report on the entire survey results will be posted on the website.

BREAKDOWN OF RESULTS BY NONRESIDENTS VERSUS VOTING RESIDENTS

Voting residents survey respondents represented a total of 111 parcels. Those parcels have a taxable property value of \$48.7 million. On the gulf-front, 100% of the resident parcels responded yes; on the gulf interior, 98% of the resident parcels responded voted yes; and on the bayside, 90% of the resident parcels responding voted yes.

When combined, 96% of all voting resident parcels with a taxable property value of \$47.7 million voted yes. 4% of all resident parcels with a taxable property value of \$1 million voted no.

Nonresident survey respondents represented a total of 420 parcels with a taxable property value of \$281.2 million. On the gulf-front, 92% of the nonresident parcels voted yes; on the gulf interior, 91% of the nonresident parcels voted yes; and on the bayside, 77.5% of the nonresident parcels voted yes.

When combined, 90% of all responding nonresident parcels with a taxable property value of \$196.8 million voted yes. 10% of all nonresident parcels with a taxable value of \$21.4 million voted no.
